months, all the FY2017 revaluation communities will have been certified, as we prepare for tax rate setting season.

*The Municipal Modernization Act is now law!* The groundbreaking Municipal Modernization Act has been passed by the Legislature and was signed into law by Governor Baker Tuesday, August 9, 2016. Lane Partridge, Chair of the MAAO Legislative Committee will be giving us a legislative update at our next evening workshop planned for later this month.

The Legislative Committee worked closely with DLS staff over the last year, in particular Municipal Finance Law Bureau Chief, Kathleen Colleary, to review the proposed legislation and to include several MAAO legislative initiatives into the bill. Although it provides for many improvements and local control over the entire gamut of municipal opera-

tions, the Act in particular includes several provisions that will result in some of the biggest changes in the commonwealth's assessing profession. The law includes scores of initiatives supported by MAAO that were advocated for inclusion in the bill. A number of these measures will have significant positive impact in the work we do. The bill originally included 23 initiatives in 52 sections of the bill that MAAO supported. MAAO testified and had extensive meetings with committee chairs and key legislators on issues important to the organization.

Our next scheduled county meeting will be our fall evening workshop and meeting, to be held on Thursday, September 22, 2016, at the Grill on the Hill, at 1929 Skyline Drive in Worcester. Ellen Blanchard, Chief Assessor from Carver, will be sharing her expertise on Chapter Land and will answer any questions or concerns you may have

regarding this topic. There will be two (2) Re-Certification Credits offered for this meeting. Remember, you are now able to register *ON-LINE* for all events! For more details, look for our Education Update in this newsletter. I also want to thank our Education Committee Co-Chairs, Cindy Cosgrove and Mary Oliver, and all committee members for their hard work and dedication, as well as the Site Committee, Chaired by Rosemary Scully.

I am pleased to report that we have seen an increase in Scholarship Applications this year! That tells me that either, municipal budgets have gotten tighter, and there is more need for scholarships, or that there are more members remembering and taking advantage of our scholarship fund program, or both. To date, we have received and approved five (5) applications totaling \$1,577.05, thus far.

The WCAA Scholarship Fund was established to

## WORCESTER COUNTY ASSESSORS ASSOCIATION'S ONLINE REGISTRATION SYSTEM

WCAA has changed over to a new online registration process for all of our workshops, and evening meetings. Like anything new, we expect there will be some growing pains and hiccups as part of the process of changing over to the new system, so I just wanted to take a minute to review the new registration process.

I know we all hate change, but by changing over to the new system we eliminate a lot of problems. We had many issues with not receiving signups until after the counts were due, or sometimes not until after the event. Having unregistered attendees was problematic and resulted in both shortages of workshop materials, and inaccurate food counts for our vendors.

The process will be to use the link in the email you receive for the event to bring you to the registration page. If you lose your email you can always go to our website at <u>www.wcaa-ma.org</u>. There is an events page you can access from the main menu on the site that will bring you to the registration page as well.

Fill in the short form with your name, type of membership and carefully type your email address. **Before you hit submit**, *please type your community name in the comment field*. Once you submit your registration, you are officially signed up. You will receive an invoice for the meeting via email that you will submit for payment. You can still pay at the door as long as you have preregistered. You should just bring your receipt.

Each person in your office <u>must</u> sign up individually. If you do not receive an email after sign-up please notify me at

Please remember that once you register on the site you must notify us of any changes, or you are responsible for payment.



## MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING April 21, 2016

A Meeting of the Worcester County Assessors Association was held at the "Public House" in Sturbridge.

President John Valade called the meeting to order at 6:15 PM.

A motion was made, seconded and voted unanimously in favor to accept the Minutes of the December 2, 2015 meeting.

A motion was made, seconded and voted unanimously in favor to accept the Treasurer's Report as of March 31, 2016.

Cindy Cosgrove, Co- chair of the Education Committee said that Clerk's Meeting will be held in May 19th and will be a "Free Workshop" for "Worcester County Members" to be held at the Shrewsbury Town Hall.

Cindy introduced our speaker for the evening, William Mitchell, RMA, MAA, of Leominster who spoke about the "Assessor's Role after a Disaster" and Supplemental Billing and Supplemental Abatements.

Mr. Mitchell told the Association that all Cities and Towns are required to do "Supplemental Billing" and "Supplemental Abatements" unless the City or Town has voted not to. When the valuation of a property increases by over 50% due to an "Occupancy Permit" a "Supplemental Bill" will be issued. When a property is damaged due to a fire or natural disaster a "Supplemental Abatement" can be issued. (Please see IGR 03-209 for more information)

On June 1, 2011, Mr. Mitchell was working for the town of Sturbridge when a tornado struck the town. He informed the association to qualify for reimbursement for "Public Property" up to 75% for the first 70 hours of response; there are thresholds that must be met by state and county. All time and materials must be tracked. "Private Property" damage must be reviewed with the assistance of the Fire Chief or Building Inspector. It is important to be sensitive to the situation, wear identification document the percentage of damage, how the landscape has changed, be sensitive to time constraints.
